Rev. Dr. Reginald F. Davis, Ph.D.

Reginald F. Davis, Ph.D. is Pastor of the Historic First Baptist Church in Williamsburg, VA. He holds a Master of Divinity degree from Colgate Rochester Divinity School, Rochester, New York, and a Ph.D. in Humanities from Florida State University. He served as the Dean of Students at Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary in Evanston, Illinois, and also, served on the faculties of Barry University and Florida A&M University in Tallahassee, Florida. In 2004 the *Journal of Religious Thought* accepted publication of his article titled "African American Interpretation of Scripture." He is the author of eight books, including the groundbreaking work, "Frederick Douglas: A Precursor of Liberation Theology" (Mercer University Press, 2005); "The Black Church: Relevant or Irrelevant in the 21st Century" (Smyth & Helwys Publishing, Inc. 2010); "Bible Study for Busy Pastors and Ministers" (Resource Publications, Wipf & Stock Publishers, 2011); and "From Wall Street to Main Street Why America is Being Destroyed From Within (Wipf & Stock Publishers, 2013; A Dangerous Journey Those Who Become Jesus' Disciples, (Christian Publishers, 2017); Bible Study for Busy Pastors and Ministers Volume 2; and Transforming Faith to Shape the World Around Us (Nurturing Faith Publishers) October 2019. God's Truth to Youth In A World Full of Lies And Deception, June 2022 (Sunbury Press); Bible Study for Busy Pastors And Ministers Volume 3, 2024. He is the current recipient of the most prestigious Historic Preservation Medal by the National Society Daughters of American Revolution and the NAACP Distinguished Pastoral Membership Award!

Dr. Davis is affiliated with the Baptist General Convention, the American Baptist Churches of the South, National and Progressive Baptist Conventions, Hampton Ministers Conference, the NAACP, and the Tri-County Pastors' Council in Williamsburg, VA. He has been a frequent radio guest in Memphis, TN, and lectures at colleges, universities, and churches across the nation.

Dr. Davis contributes his accomplishments to the glory of God. He further believes that the Word of God is the best education of all because it is the power of God unto salvation. At the end of his Christian journey, he wants to be able to say as the Apostle Paul, "I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith."

Dr. Davis currently resides in Williamsburg, VA with his wife and they have three children.

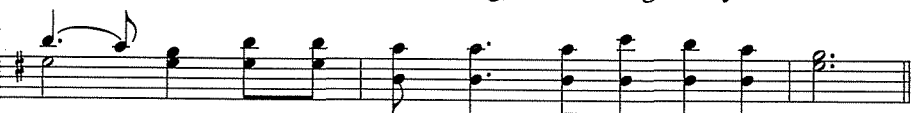

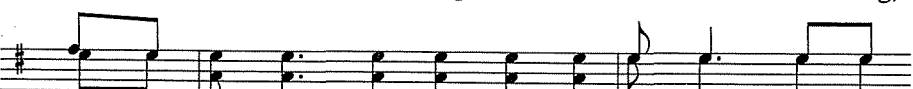

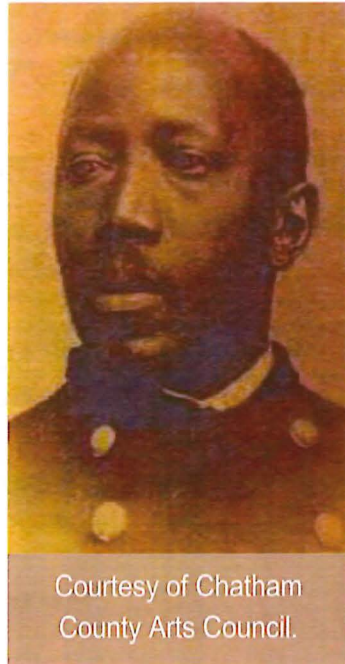
